

## New opportunities for Australian defence industry

A suite of new initiatives announced in Canberra last week is expected to assist Australian businesses to better participate in defence procurement.

Assistant Defence Minister, Mal Brough, announced a suite of initiatives in four key programs, to improve opportunities and coordination for Australian defence industries.

"These new initiatives are part of ongoing work in progress to reform and improve the process of defence procurement from Government to Defence to industry," Mr Brough said.

"These measures are complimentary to new defence industry sector plans also announced today."

Mr Brough said the new initiatives fall into four key programs:

### Defence Small Business Access.

- The establishment of a Small Business Access Unit in Defence will ensure small business can easily access every opportunity to participate in the Defence procurement marketplace. Dedicated staff in the Defence Material Organisation will be on hand to case manages small business inquiries, ranging from sales, to requests for information on future contracts to development of innovative proposals.

### Small Business in the Supply Chain.

- The Supply Chain Management Plan will result in a more healthy, robust and innovative supply chain for major Defence projects. The Government has identified strategic capabilities for Australian industry and will ensure Prime contractors actively use the marketplace to keep these vital capabilities alive

### The Defence Technology Investment Program.

- The Defence Technology Investment Program will spend up to \$20 million a year involving large and small businesses in research, development and demonstration of technologies critical to Australia's future Defence Force

### Defence Export Facilitation.

- Defence will build on Australian

defence exporters' success in selling to foreign buyers. The 'Team Australia' Defence export facilitation program will involve a new Defence marketing push supported by military officers promoting Australia's competitive advantages and local successes in niche technologies. Opening up export markets and increasing our participating in global supply chains will keep a healthy defence industry here in Australia.

Mr Brough said these initiatives would help open future opportunities in Australia and overseas for Australian industry including small business.

### INDUSTRY SECTOR PLANS RELEASED

Mr Brough also announced that the Government had endorsed the Aerospace and Electronic Systems Sector Plans that had been subject to detailed consultation with industry over the past two years.

"The Aerospace and Electronics Sector Plans provide the basis to sustain those industry capabilities critical to Australia's national security needs," Mr Brough said.

"The sector plans will see the consolidation of the aerospace support sector around several prime contractors managing multiple aerospace platforms in a contestable market for long-term support contracts."

"The plans aim to improve the capabilities, capacity and contractual performance of defence industry and to manage demand to offer a better commercial basis for investment."

"The sector plans propose a more strategic approach to Defence procurement. In particular avoiding the ad-hoc project by project approach to Defence procurement.

"This will help facilitate long-term industry investment in the sustainment of strategic industry capabilities"

Mr Brough said the sector plans will better position Australian industry to

meet the research and development, labour skills and industrial capability requirements associated with an expected 30 percent increase in demand, over the next decade, to deliver the \$50 billion Defence Capability Plan."

"These two plans follow on the plan for naval shipbuilding arising out of the Carnegie-Wylie report and the Government is currently considering land and weapons issues."

"While the Howard Government has improved Defence procurement, there is still a long way to go in the process of reform. These plans complement the work being done to reform the Defence Material Organisation after the Kinnaird Review."

"These sector plans help coordinate the Government and specific defence industry capabilities for Australia's long term national security efforts," Mr Brough said

### ASLAV to get enhanced level of protection

Defence Minister Robert Hill has announced two projects designed to significantly enhance the level of protection provided to Australian troops deployed in Australian Light Armoured Vehicles (ASLAV).

The first of these projects will strengthen the interior lining of ASLAVs due to be deployed to Iraq in August, providing increased protection against rocket-propelled grenades and ballistic attack. 'Spall liners' made from a Kevlar-type material will be fitted to the vehicles at a cost of \$2.85 million.

"The spall liners increase protection provided to soldiers by minimising the internal damage to the vehicles if the armour is penetrated," Senator Hill said.

"The purpose-built spall liner uses world-leading technology to reduce the impact of shaped charges such as those attached to rocket-propelled grenades and will also provide the ASLAVs with enhanced ballistic protection."

The second project will fit Kongsberg's Remote Weapons Station to the Personnel Carrier variant of the ASLAV at a cost of \$8.9 million. This will provide extra protection to the crew commander. ▶ PAGE 2

"Remote weapons stations equipped with thermal imaging cameras enable the crew commander to operate the vehicle's 50 calibre machine gun around the clock and from within the vehicle, minimising their exposure to enemy fire," Senator Hill said.

"In addition, the remote weapons station can be fitted with a 40mm automatic grenade launcher and has the potential to incorporate the Javelin anti tank/bunker buster missile system."

Senator Hill said the Defence Materiel Organisation had worked closely with industry to rapidly acquire the two protective measures in response to capabilities required by soldiers on the ground in Iraq.

There are currently about 240 personnel protected by the six ASLAVs which provide security for Australia's diplomats and deployed forces throughout Iraq. The next rotation of personnel is due in about September.

### Boeing to manage F-111 Cold Proof Load Test Facility

The Boeing Aerospace Support Centre-Amberley will take over Cold Proof Load Test facility management and servicing for RAAF's F-111s. The CPLT facility, designed to apply specific airframe loads in a controlled environment, was commissioned at RAAF Amberley in July 2001. Responsibility for CPLT services, operation and maintenance of the facility will be transitioned from the Commonwealth of Australia over 12 months. To date, Boeing Australia has undertaken operator training and has successfully conducted a number of cold proof load test servicings on behalf of the Commonwealth.

Boeing Australia holds a 10-year, \$A500 million agreement, signed in August 2001, for deeper level maintenance and weapon system upgrades for the RAAF's fleet of F/RF-111 aircraft.

### Naval Shipbuilding at Forgacs Cairncross Dockyard

Stephen Forgacs, the Managing Director and Chief Executive of FORGACS Group has announced that his company has teamed with Raytheon Australia to bid for Navy's new amphibious ships.

The announcement coincided with the 60th birthday of Cairncross Dockyard and an inspection of the facility by Minister for Industry, Tourism and Resources, Hon Ian Macfarlane, MP.

"Forgacs/Raytheon present a very strong team for naval shipbuilding in Australia and the Cairncross Dockyard has an important and unique role to play in the forthcoming projects," Mr Forgacs said.

'Cairncross is the ideal location for consolidating amphibious ships' modules built elsewhere in Australia and the skilled workforce is already in-place.'

FORGACS Engineering Pty Ltd is headquartered in Newcastle, NSW and employs 650 people across Australia.

### Weapons Simulation System for Army

Four weapons training facilities will be constructed for the Australian Army to enhance marksmanship training and weapon handling, Defence Minister Robert Hill has announced. The new Weapons Training Simulation Systems will be located at Latchford Barracks, Bonegilla in Victoria, Irwin Barracks in Perth and subsequently at sites in South Australia and Queensland.

The Army currently has nine facilities at Darwin, Townsville, Enogerra, Singleton, Duntroon, Holsworthy, Kapooka, Puckapunyal and Watsonia. The RAAF has two facilities at Williamstown and Amberley.

Senator Hill said the tender process would begin today [23 June] with the release of the tender for the Bonegilla and Perth facilities. The project includes the acquisition of system hardware, software and modified weapons and installation at purpose built facilities. The total cost of the four new WTSS is estimated at \$15 million.

"The Weapons Training Simulation System is a state-of-the-art laser-based small arms simulation system that is used to train Australian Defence Force personnel in marksmanship and weapon handling," Senator Hill said.

"The facilities allow personnel to practice shooting with a range of laser-fitted weapons at computer-generated targets and scenarios. Trainers are then able to play back the exercise to provide feedback on accuracy and technique."

The facilities in Victoria and Western Australia will be completed later this year, the extra weapons types will be delivered to eight of the existing sites and two of the new sites next year. The final two facilities in South Australia and Queensland are due to be completed by mid-2007.

### Nautronix wins two Navy contracts

West Australian company Nautronix Ltd has been awarded contracts worth almost \$18 million to enhance the RAN's maritime test and exercise and mine warfare capabilities, Defence Minister Robert Hill has announced.

The contracts are for the provision of a Portable Tracking Range at a cost of \$9.248 million and Minecountermeasures Underwater Computer Systems at a cost of \$8.6 m.

The Portable Tracking Range will be used to conduct new equipment and systems tests and trials, development programs and tactical exercises outside the current fixed deep water tracking range off WA.

"The Navy will use the range initially to test the replacement Heavyweight Torpedoes for the COLLINS Class submarines," Senator Hill said.

"The range will also be used when the Navy conducts acceptance trials of the Eurotorp Lightweight Torpedo on surface and air platforms and for shallow water certification activities for the COLLINS Class

submarines.

"The range, to be delivered in July next year, is environmentally friendly as all elements of the range are recovered after the exercise or test is completed."

The Minecountermeasures Underwater Computer System will provide RAN Clearance Divers with a modern electronic means to navigate in open water, conduct searches of inshore waters, and log various data elements in real time.

This technology was originally funded through the Defence Capability Technology Demonstrator program. The new system will be delivered to the Navy in 2006 after prototype test and trials activities.

### A boost for network centric systems

The development of Network Centric Systems has just been made easier. A major capability gap is set to be filled as Syntonic Technologies, an Australian R&D company, and Permian, a Defence Electronic Systems and Simulation SME, have signed an agreement to develop Syntonic's patented mobile satellite antenna technology.

Syntonic's owner, Mr Mark Smith, said that this antenna would provide Network Centric Systems designers and engineers with the first truly mobile satellite communications capability from geostationary satellites – one that simultaneously provides high mobility and high bandwidth.

"Our prototypes have tested successfully in standard off-road vehicles at speed and over rough roads. Permian's advanced software design tools will be invaluable for adapting the antenna to other frequencies, and its expertise in real-time antenna control algorithms will ensure maximum performance for any application," Mr Smith said.

The antenna is the subject of an Unsolicited Innovative Proposal that is currently being evaluated by Defence. If adopted, the proposal will enable satellite communications on the move for all land and sea vehicles and vessels, including those too small or too unstable for current tracking antennas.

### Former Chief of Navy joins Austal

The former Chief of the Royal Australian Navy, Vice Admiral (Rtd) David Shackleton AO, has joined Australian shipbuilder Austal as an advisor.

Austal Executive Chairman Mr John Rothwell AO said Vice Admiral Shackleton will provide general strategic advice to Austal on Australian and international naval and defence industry opportunities.

"Vice Admiral Shackleton's extensive knowledge and experience and contacts in relation to the Australian and foreign navies will significantly help Austal's strategy to build on our defence shipbuilding success to date," Mr Rothwell said.

Vice Admiral Shackleton was Chief of Navy from July 1999 to July 2002.
